

Dear Participant,

We thank you for your interest in our program. Our program exists to serve those in need of substance abuse recovery services. CORE's recovery program also offers housing and spiritual growth opportunities. We are unable to accept sex offenders and violent offenders.

The initial cost is \$320. \$120 for the first week's program fee plus a \$200 nonrefundable administrative fee. The program fee is due every week thereafter by Friday evening. This will cover your classes, local transportation needs, and housing (including essentials, such as, toilet paper, laundry detergent, etc.)

The non-negotiable entry fee must be paid upon your arrival. Due to the overwhelming interest in our program, CORE cannot guarantee placement and if approved will send a letter of approval contingent on legal parties involved, bed availability and the entry fee of \$320. We do an extensive background check Nationwide. CORE is not a home plan, but is a recovery program that provides housing!

Our program is one year in duration, with the opportunity to join a second year program. If you are seeking substance abuse recovery services, and by this truly seeking a new way of living, please take the time to fill out the application.

All questions must be answered; any blank spaces will deem your application as rejected. If a question does not apply just put N/A in the space. Your answers can affect your acceptance into the CORE Peer Program. I have enclosed additional information about our program to help you make your decision.

THE PEER PROJECT

What is it?

The CORE Peer Project is a supportive services program designed to offer transitional housing to residents, who desire to apply their leadership and mentoring skills, the opportunity to support the facility as well as the new member.

Participants of the Peer Project must be willing to commit to the following:

- Minimum of one year consecutive residence in a house with no alcohol or drug use.
- For the first 120 days in the house, participants must attend all functions including meetings, classes and workshops.
- Must complete 12-Step requirements and be of service to newer residents.

In addition:

- Participants will have access to a computer for internet training and research.
- Participants who have not completed High School will receive GED education, allowing for a higher earning potential when seeking employment.
- Transportation will be provided as needed.



THE PEER PROJECT

Basic Guidelines

- Upon entry client is required to pay first week's program fee of \$120 plus a nonrefundable \$200 administrative fee for a total of \$320, unless on a fixed income then it is \$720 to enter paying the whole month plus the administrative fee, thereafter it will be \$520 per month.
- Weekly program fee of \$120 due on Friday
- Client may be subject to random drug testing
- Client curfew is 10PM
- No nights out the first 60 days, then 2 nights a month thereafter
- Client will have a house chore to be done on Monday and Thursday by 10:00 PM
- Client must attend house meeting
- Attend classes and meetings on schedule
- WorkTwelve Steps of AA
- Client is responsible for his/her own personal food and meals



THE PEER PROJECT - PEER HOUSE RULES

- 1. Relapse is an **IMMEDIATE** removal from the program for a minimum of 30 days.
 - a. Refer to Relapse Policy effective January 1, 2012, which is posted in each home.
- 2. House Managers are in charge of their respective home. Matters will be handled on a case-by-case basis. Any grievances shall be taken to the Program Manager.
- 3. You <u>CAN</u> be removed from the program for disruptive or aggressive behavior. Laying hands on another person in an aggressive manner <u>WILL</u> lead to your removal.
- 4. **NO SMOKING** in the houses, use the designated smoking areas.
- 5. Curfew is 10 pm to 6 am Saturday through Thursday. Friday's curfew is 12 am.
- 6. After 60 days you will be allowed 2 nights out per month.
 - a. Request forms must be turned in a minimum of one week prior to departure.
 - b. All nights out are subject to the Program Manager's approval.
 - c. Program Fees are to be at a \$0 balance.
 - d. Your nights out may be taken with family members whose contact information will be listed on the request forms.
 - e. Manipulation of this privilege may result in your removal from the program.
- 7. Driving without a license or driving an illegal vehicle is cause for removal.
- 8. **NO** members of the opposite sex allowed in the homes.
- 9. NO same sex relations in the homes.
- 10. House Meetings are mandatory. (unless at work)
- 11. The following are subject to either a fine or a work slip:
 - a. Leaving out personal items.
 - b. Not doing chores. (Chores are to be completed by 10:00 P.M.)
 - c. Not making bed.
 - d. Not keeping assigned area clean.
- 12. If program fees are 3 weeks past due, you may face the possibility of removal from the program.
- 13. If not heard from in a 24 hour period you will be considered removed from the program.
- 14. Theft will lead to immediate removal from the program.
- 15. Program Fees are \$120.00 per week.
- 16. No person active in his or her addiction is allowed on our property.
- 17. All policies are subject to change at the discretion of management.
